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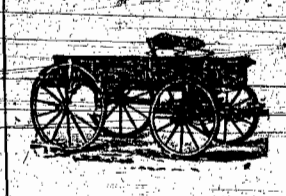

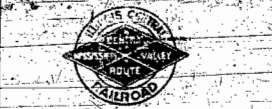

CLOCKS OF THE PAST.

They were very different from the modern time-telling machines. The word "clock," derived from the French cloche, German kloche, signifying a bell, and used to designate a bell which was struck at certain periods of time indicated by the hour-glass. Sundials, or "gnomons," were the first instruments used in measuring time and there is but little doubt that the gnomon pillars which the Egyptians used were used by the Egyptians, if not an actual sundial hands, at least for some astronomical observations of the movement of the sun. Clepsydras, or water clocks, and sundials came next in order. The flow of sand through a small orifice is an accurate method of measuring time, for the rate of the sand is always regular, but water is influenced by the laws of hydrostatics—when the vessel is full the water runs out faster than when it is nearly empty. Candle clocks or tapers on which were colored bands indicating how much was consumed in a certain time were also used, and their invention is attributed to Alfred the Great; but this method is even more susceptible to error than the previous ones. What Lemons Will Do. No family should be without lemon juice. Their uses almost too many for enumeration. The juice of a lemon in hot water, on awakening in the morning, is an excellent liver corrector. Citronine and lemon juice and salt on a bit of absorbent cotton, is the best thing in the world for a fever-parched patient. A dash of lemon juice in plain water is an excellent tooth-wash. It not only removes tartar, but sweetens the breath. A teaspoonful of the juice in a small cup of black coffee will almost certainly relieve a bilious headache. The finest of manure acids made by putting a teaspoonful of lemon juice in a cupful of warm water. This removes most stains from the fingers and nails and loosens the cuticle more satisfactorily than can be done by the use of a sharp instrument. Lemon juice and salt will remove rust stains from linen without injury to fabric. Wet the stain with the mixture and put the article in the sun. Two or three applications may be necessary if the stain is of long standing, but the remedy never fails. Lemon juice (outward application) will allay the irritation caused by the bites of gnats and flies.
